

FIRST READING: Isaiah 35:1-10

The People sit.

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom;

THE CREED

The Celebrant continues

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN**.



NOTES ABOUT THE MUSIC: Today's Psalm tune is the tune that J. S. Bach used for today's Opening Voluntary, *Nun komm der heiden Heiland*, which is Hymn 52, "Savior of the Nations, Come." Bach's setting illustrates the text, with the pleading of the world for a redeeming Savior. It has a well-ornamented melody against a solemn accompaniment, with plodding pedal notes.

Today's Anthem is the best-known choral work by Lutheran composer Paul Manz (1919-2009). It was written as a gift to those who prayed for Manz's young son, John, during his critical illness. John recovered, became a Lutheran pastor, and sang this piece to his father, along with his family, as Manz was dying in 2009. The text and music reflect deep faith.

The Magnificat being sung today during Communion is a contemporary setting of the Song of Mary from the Book of Luke, set by American composer Randall Thompson. Jacques Berthier, who is best known as the composer of the music of the Taize Community, including today's Communion hymn, was a contemporary Parisian organist.

Today's Closing Voluntary comes from a book of variations on hymn tunes.
