



It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.



We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

NOTES ABOUT THE MUSIC: Tonight's music includes some less well-known Christmas Carols. "The Holly and the Ivy" is a traditional English Carol, with a melody first collected in 1911. The music that the choir sings from tonight was copyrighted and published in 1920 and has been in our music files for many years. Just as we are celebrating the 100th anniversary of the dedication of our Pilcher pipe organ, it is great to also sing some of the traditional favorites from 1925, such as this anthem. The text uses imagery of the holly and the ivy to illustrate both Christmas and Easter.

Another traditional carol is "Bring a Torch, Jeannette, Isabella," which is the basis for our Closing Voluntary tonight. It is a French carol from Provence, which describes two shepherdesses bringing a torch to the manger in Bethlehem.
